Burstow and Smallfield Neighbourhood Plan has reached a milestone and is now published for Consultation between the **5th January until the 15th February 2026 (11.59pm)**

Neighbourhood plans give local people the power to shape the area where they live and, if adopted, will form part of the statutory Development Plan.

This means that our neighbourhood plan must be taken into account when planning decisions are made in our area.

Our neighbourhood plan area covers the whole of the Burstow Parish area.

We have developed four key themes covering housing, flooding, transport and protecting our local green spaces.
